Soft Proofing in Photoshop

This month's program will demonstrate how to use the technique of soft proofing to get monitor presentations that accurately depict how an image will look when printed. The presentation will cover required prerequisites (monitor calibration and profiling, creating and obtaining appropriate ICC profiles, etc.) as well the use of proof setup dialogue, print dialogue, and print driver settings in Photoshop. A few words on applying these techniques to other software - Photoshop Elements, Capture NX, Lightroom (limited), and others will be included.



Infant Bereavement Photography: Now I Lay Me Down To Sleep

The practice of memorializing a beloved infant or child shares a history as long as that of photography itself. Photographs of children lost at an early age were often kept in family Bibles or made into lockets, as a way of remembering and easing grief.

Memorial Photography, also known as Remembrance Photography or Bereavement Photography, is a subject that is often considered too morbid or uncomfortable to be considered in today's society. On March 14th, SPS will host a presentation by Michele Calderon, Area Coordinator for Now I Lay Me Down To Sleep, an organization of 7,000 volunteer professional photographers both in the US and abroad, who serve families that have suffered the ultimate grief: the loss (or expected loss) of an infant.

She printed it out in color and didn't like it.....so in Picasa she changed it to black and white and thought it captured the moment. 
Luba Ricket photographed this fabric **Swaying In The Breeze** (1st place Assigned, above) with a Nikon D80 and Tamron 18-250 mm. lens @ f/6.3, 1/160 sec; ISO: 200, in natural daylight in her backyard. She had taken about 30 shots as the wind whipped the clothes. Cropped, then tried different blurs for the background. Finally a motion blur, in the direction of the wind blowing, was applied.**Barb Lawton** photographed **Boys Will Be Boys** (1st place General, below) early afternoon at a pond in central Mass., with a Canon 50D and Nikon Canon 18-270 mm. IS lens @ f/8.0, 1/90 sec. ISO: 400. Grab shot of boys playing in a pond on a very warm fall day. Trees reflected color onto the pond. Photo was tweaked in CS5 and then painted by hand with Corel Painter software.
