HANCOCK SHAKER VILLAGE



Join us on Wednesday, December 16th, as Ben Garver takes us on a photographic journey

through the Hancock Shaker Village.

Ben Garver has been photographing news at *The Berkshire Eagle* for two decades and photographing nature since his youth. Before living in the Berkshires, Ben lived in New Hampshire, Vermont and his native Ohio. From growing up on his father's farm, going to school at Middlebury College in Vermont to living in the Berkshires, all of Ben's intellectual pursuits have been paralleled with the pursuit of solace in nature.



The Shakers trace their beginnings to

Manchester, England, in 1747. They called themselves The United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Appearing and soon became known as Shakers because of the trembling, whirling, and shaking they engaged in during ecstatic worship services. They came to America in 1774, seeking freedom to live, work and worship.

The Hancock community, the third of nineteen major Shaker villages established in New England, New York, Kentucky, Ohio and Indiana, grew under the leadership of Joseph Meacham and Lucy Wright, with land donated by converted farmers. At the peak of its success in the 1840s, the Hancock community had more than 3,000 acres and 300 members. The community gradually declined, in part due to the urban migration that followed the Industrial Revolution. By the early 1900s, only 50 members remained, most of them children. Eventually, excess land was sold and many buildings were destroyed. Concerned citizens stepped in to preserve the Village in the 1960s.

Today, the 750-acre Hancock Shaker Village operates as a living-history museum open to the public with 20 authentic Shaker buildings, costumed interpreters, rich collections of Shaker furniture and artifacts in rotating exhibits, a full schedule of activities and workshops, a mile-long hiking trail and picnic areas, a Village Store and Village Cafe, and a working farm with extensive gardens and heritage-breed livestock. Hancock Shaker Village is located on Route 20 in Pittsfield, Massachusetts, just west of the junction of Routes 20 and 41. Open every day during the season, plan to visit them in 2016 from April 16 to October 30.

FREQUENCY SEPARATION FOR PORTRAIT RETOUCHING December 9 - Presented by Sean Sullivan

Sean will be giving a demonstration of Frequency Separation Technique...virtually a process of decomposing image data into spatial frequencies (in this case tone and color) in order to edit image details in the different frequencies independently. There can be any number of frequencies in each image, and each frequency will contain certain information (based on the size of the details). Many other techniques used to fix skin problems can make for an unnatural look to the image (i.e., the porcelain skin look). Using this technique, you can edit the tone or color of the skin or texture independently thus preserving the natural look and feel of the model. He will be providing links to more details, videos and Photoshop Actions during his discussion. A must see for you portrait photographers!




